The Lesson from the Epistle of blessed Paul the Apostle to the Corinthians. I Cor. **12, 27–31**

BRETHREN: Ye are the body of Christ, and members in particular. And God hath set some in the Church, first apostles, secondarily prophets, thirdly teachers, after that miracles, then gifts of healings, helps, governments, diversities of tongues. Are all apostles? are all prophets? are all teachers? are all workers of miracles? have all the gifts of healing? do all speak with tongues? do ail interpret? But covet earnestly the best gifts. *℟*. And he came down with them and stood in the plain, and the company of his disciples, and a great multitude of people out of all Judea and Jerusalem, and from the sea coast of Tyre and Sidon, which came to hear him, and to be healed of their diseases; and they that were vexed with unclean spirits, and they were healed. John 1, 1-14

IN the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. The same was in the beginning with God.
