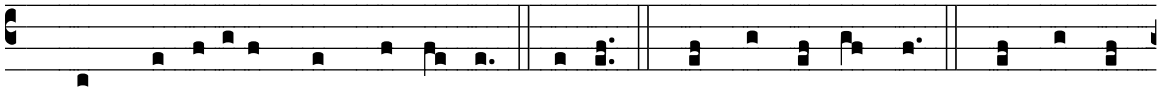

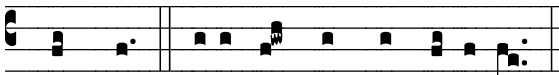
Solemn Preface of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus

Dominations, and with all the company of the heavenly host, we sing the majesty of thy glory, evermore praising thee, and saying:

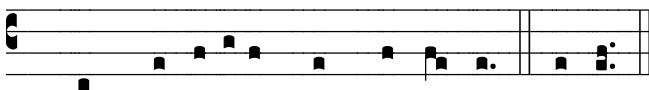
